





TOUGHBOOK®

Spirit of Blue launched a Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) initiative as part of its safety grant program in 2024. MDT's allow calls to be dispatched, plate and subject searches to be run and transmission of critical officer safety data, all without officers or dispatch needing to go out over the radio. Panasonic Toughbook generously donated 28 CF-33 smart tablets with attachable keyboard units which were converted into grants to seven agencies in 2024.




\$2,000,000 IN GRANTED VALUE

Spirit of Blue crossed the \$2,000,000 mark in granted equipment and training.

The foundation granted its first \$1,000,000 over the course of its first ten years of operation, from 2011-2021. In the 2021 Annual Report the foundation set a goal of granting the next \$1,000,000 in half that time, by 2026. We are proud to share that we have reached that milestone in just three years!





The Sadieville (KY) Police Department received two Panasonic Toughbook CF-33 tablets with detachable keyboards for installation in their vehicles. Their previous computers were no longer serviceable and were running Windows XP, taking up to 30 minutes to complete an e-ticket on a traffic stop. The new computers reduced that time by 2/3! The grant was sponsored by Panasonic Toughbook. Grant value - \$8,631





The Euclid (OH) Police Department received 106 Guardian Angel Elite Series Red/Blue wearable lights with Universal Mounts. Additionally, they received one Armourer's Choice Patroller Level III rifle-rated ballistic shield. The grant was given in memory of Euclid Police Officer Jacob Derbin who was killed in the line of duty – <u>EOW 5/11/24</u>. The grant was sponsored by the Law Enforcement United, with accessories donated by Guardian Angel Devices. Grant value - \$20,229





The Spokane County (WA) Sheriff's Office received 131 Guardian Angel Elite Series Red/Blue/IR wearable lights with Universal Mounts to outfit their patrol deputies and K9's. This includes officers serving with the Spokane Valley (WA) Police Department. The grant was sponsored by Law Enforcement United, with Guardian Angel Devices donating the accessories. On August 23, 2024, Deputy Jacob Hamm (right) of the Marshall County (KY) Sheriff's Office was shot through the arm on a barricaded subject callout in neighboring Murray, KY. Fellow members of the MCSO Special Response Team returned fire while moving Dep. Hamm to cover. Chief Deputy Tim Reynolds (left) applied his granted tourniquet to stop the bleeding until Dep. Hamm could be evacuated to a medical center for treatment. Dep. Hamm has made a full recovery and has returned to duty.



Forward Looking - 2025



- 2024 saw a successful launch of our In-Car Computer program in partnership with Panasonic Toughbook and Gamber-Johnson. In 2025 we will look to continue this program and improve our performance in this area.
- We will continue our long-term tourniquet support program for statewide training academies in Montana, Oregon and Wyoming. We will also be looking to expand this program into other western states where academy training is consolidated. Existing partnerships have resulted in 311 tourniquets being awarded to officers from 109 different agencies in three states.
- The Foundation seeks to grant a minimum of 1,000 tourniquets and 500 Guardian Angel personal lighting devices as part of initiatives to see these items become standard issue for officers' uniforms nationwide.
- With \$2,000,000 in awarded grants completed, our next goal is to add an additional \$1,000,000 in granted value by 2030.
